Dr. Abdullah A. Rabeeah was appointed Minister of Health (MOH), Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in February 2009. Previous to this appointment, Dr. Al Rabeeah was Chief Executive Officer, National Health Affairs from 2003 – 2009, as well as, President, King Saud bin Abdulaziz University for Health Sciences from 2005 – 2009.

Dr. Al Rabeeah obtained his MBBS, Faculty of Medicine, from King Saud University, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia in July 1979. He completed his internship and pediatric surgery fellowship from the Dalhousie University, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada. He completed his residency in General Surgery and Pediatric General Surgery at the University of Alberta Hospital, Edmonton, Alberta, Canada.

Dr. Al Rabeeah pioneered the establishment of three Pediatric Surgery Units with International Standards, and commissioned numerous major projects within the Kingdom such as King Abdullah Specialist Hospital for Children, Riyadh; King Saud bin Abdulaziz University for Health Sciences, Riyadh/Jeddah/AI Ahsa; and King Abdullah International Medical Research Center, Riyadh.
